and attracts a large number of participants to the regular programme of craft and leisure sessions, organised by and for everyone in the community. Specialist workshops are also arranged on an ad hoc basis when there is interest in a particular craft. All the groups are informal drop -in sessions and visitors are welcome to attend one or more sessions per week without making any commitment or signing up to such. However, individuals including beginners, can attend as many or as few sessions as they choose and there is a wealth of expertise in each group and all skill levels welcome; ideas and skills are freely shared and everyone is offered help if requested. Costs are kept low to encourage everyone to have a go. Regular workshops are day session. Alternatively, charges are just £3 for a morning or afternoon session. However many regular crafters opt to pay an annual subscription of £100 which lets them take part in as many sessions as they like. Additional specialist workshops with outside tutors may be charged separately.

Mistakes were made, weaving had to be unwoven, but it ended up as a finished item and without the fantastic help and advice from Lynne Morse, probably just a mess on the floor!!My confidence was very shaky but I found a book online which looked at the basics and beyond and after reading the first pages, more than once I must add, technical details started to unravel, hopefully the weaving was not to follow. It gave sound advice on length which was worrying me and with a little more confidence a second scarf emerged this time for Polly. ..

As a complete 'newbee' to this art, I have never tried anything like this before, I have had a fabulous introduction and an increased interest to carry it further. A couple of jobs around the house need completing and then as the nights draw in this new found interest will certainly help the shorter days pass quick-
